We are directly impacted by those we surround ourselves with and it is n be good or bad.




It is important to have clarity with God on the plans for your life and know that it won't ever be something that goes against what the scriptures say. Think about your workplace settings, your social settings and take an audit of the different ways you behave and where the area out asceptible to influence away from God. Seeking wisdom and guidance based on truth in critical for having forward in behavior that glorifies God.

Sins of commission (committing a sinful act) and omission (*not* doing what is commanded) are equally self-centered, not God-centered.



We are constantly fighting for control with God. It may be easier to see what we need to stop rather than where we need to take action. For example, God calls us to engage with sinners, to share the gospel, to try and re-direct when temptations arise. But, the intent is to remain walking in step with God, not be influenced by those who are not and end up "standing in the way that sinners take or sitting in the company of mockers" (v.1)

Re-read Psalm 1:2. When have you experienced a disconnect in mutual "delight in the law of the Lord" amidst your circles and what changes have you had to make.
